I-95 EXPRESS TOLL LANESSM OPEN HOUSE TO BE HELD TUESDAY, DEC. 4

WHAT: The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) and the I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETLsSM) Project Team invite the public to its winter Open House.

WHEN: Tuesday, Dec. 4, from 5:30 to 7 p.m.

WHY: To meet members of the design and construction teams and discuss the project, its benefits and ongoing construction work. Citizens will have the opportunity to view displays and pick up project-related brochures. Light refreshments will be available.

The I-95 ETLs Project spans 10 miles of the John F. Kennedy Memorial Highway from just south of the I-95/I-895 split to just north of MD 43 in White Marsh. Once complete, the project will ease congestion and increase safety by adding two new ETLs in each direction of I-95 among other improvements. Motorists can choose to travel the general-purpose lanes at no cost or pay a toll to use the ETLs, which will be managed for relatively congestion-free traffic flow.

Current work includes construction of general-purpose ramps at the I-95/I-695 interchange, including new Kenwood Avenue and Lillian Holt Drive overpasses; work on northbound I-895 at I-95, including the Moravia Road and Moravia Park Drive overpasses; and widening of I-95 from Rossville Boulevard to Campbell Boulevard. Crews have completed replacing the Joppa Road, Cowenton Avenue and Rossville Boulevard bridges. Work on the MD 43 interchange is expected to begin in spring 2008.
