NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN ON SOUTHBOUND I-95 NORTH OF I-695

BALTIMORE, MD – On Tuesday morning Dec. 23, at approximately 5 a.m., weather permitting, traffic along three miles of southbound Interstate 95, between Campbell and Rossville Boulevards, will shift approximately 60 feet to the right of its current location. The permanent change to the traffic pattern is necessary to allow for the new express toll lanes, which will be constructed to the left of the current general-purpose lanes as part of the I-95 Express Toll LanesSM (ETLsSM) Project.

Motorists are advised to stay alert while traveling in this area and pay attention to overhead roadway signs and new lane markings. Concrete barrier walls, with openings for construction equipment, will separate highway traffic from the work area to the left.

In order for crews to perform work in advance of the new traffic pattern, single and double-lane closures will take place in this area from approximately 7 p.m. Monday, Dec. 22 to 5 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 23.

The I-95 ETLs Project spans from the I-95/I-895 split in northeast Baltimore to just north of MD 43 in White Marsh. It will result in a total of two new ETLs and four general-purpose lanes in each direction that are accommodated by bridge and interchange improvements. Motorists will have the option of using the general-purpose lanes at no cost or paying a toll to use the ETLs, which will be managed to maintain relatively congestion-free traffic flow.
